

- Fentanyl patches should only be used in patients who require a total daily dose of other opiates equaling at least 25 mcg per hour of fentanyl patch.
- Patients using fentanyl patches may require short-acting opiate supplements until fentanyl efficacy has set in or during fentanyl patch use for episodes of breakthrough pain.
- Fentanyl patch dose modifications are done based on the average daily use of a supplemental analgesic.
- Dose changes are not made prior to 72 hours after initial patch application and not prior to 6 days after a dose change.

## **Pharmacist Order Review**

- ALL fentanyl patch orders are reviewed by a pharmacist prior to dispensing. Review includes:
  - Appropriate indication for use (severe to moderate chronic pain)
  - Opiate-tolerance
  - Appropriate starting dose based on dosing history (medication reconciliation and validation of home dose)
  - Potential drug interactions and concomitant opiate use
  - Dose changes to ensure that the strength is not changed prior to 72 hours after initiation or 6 days after dose increase.
- Orders for fentanyl patches with doses of 125 mcg/hour are validated with prescriber prior to order verification by the pharmacist. This is done to avoid potential medication errors related to decimal points.
- Fentanyl order review by the pharmacist is documented in the clinical intervention/consultation data base
